Dr Tommy Leung is an evolutionary ecologist based at University of New England, Australia. He joined University of New England in 2011 as a lecturer in parasitology and evolutionary biology, and has published a number of research papers on a variety of different topics in parasitology and disease ecology including: parasites of marine molluscs, within-host interactions between parasites, evolutionary ecology of symbioses, disease outbreaks in aquaculture, the fossil record of parasites, and most recently, parasites of migratory birds.

His main research interests includes: the evolutionary ecology of host-parasite interactions, the ecology of parasite communities, the evolutionary significance of parasite life history adaptations, and the dynamics of symbiotic interactions.

He is also an active science communicator who is involved in outreach activities that communicate parasitology research to the general public.
